Profitable Courses

In our last newsletter we asked you to pray that we would make wise decisions about our class schedules. A major choice was whether or not both of us or only one of us would pursue the completion of our Masters Degrees. This was a tough decision, but in the end we felt that the best thing for our family and our ministry at this time would be for only Danny to get his MA. We have already seen the positive benefits of this decision in our family and in our ministry. One result was that it allowed Danny to rearrange his classes so that he could take some courses that previously would have been impossible to fit into the schedule. These classes have turned out to be extremely applicable to some of the most perplexing issues we are facing in our Scripture Use ministry in Wantoat and throughout Papua New Guinea.

Medical Appointments, Visas and Shipping

Beyond class work, much of our time has been devoted to seeking medical attention for our children that is not available in Papua New Guinea. None of the concerns have been dire or life-threatening, but have included such things as diagnosis and treatment of urinary reflux and tubes put in Anna's ears to drain fluid build-up that was impairing her hearing. We are grateful that we have been able to take care of some of these issues while we are home on furlough. Other time-consuming tasks have





been fulfilling the medical and clerical requirements to obtain new visas for returning to Papua New Guinea and also preparing items to ship ahead that will not fit into our limited luggage allowance. (Imagine shopping for Christmas and birthday presents for the next four years!) We have to prepare and ship these items well ahead of time, because they will travel by boat.


Summer Travel Plans

A Strategic Trip to Papua New Guinea

The study of Scripture Use is a relatively new field in the over-all work of Bible translation. A pioneer in this field of research is Dr. Wayne Dye. Wayne is one of the people who initially inspired us to pursue a specific ministry in Scripture Use (SU). Wayne and his wife, Sally, will be conducting a SU Strategies workshop in Papua New Guinea this summer. In addition to their SU knowledge the Dyes have also worked for many years in Papua New Guinea as Bible translators. So, they have a unique ability to apply the best practices of SU to the specific situation in Papua New Guinea. Wayne has asked Danny to travel to Papua New Guinea to assist in teaching the workshop. This is a tremendous opportunity to learn more from Wayne and Sally while also developing more SU leaders in Papua New Guinea. There is no guarantee that the Dyes would ever be able to return to Papua New Guinea in the future. So, in many ways this is a once in a lifetime chance. We are very grateful and excited about this opportunity!

Danny will leave on July 22nd and return on August 21st (the day before fall semester classes start!) This was an unexpected trip. This has been very well received by the Wantoat people, and while we are gone they have been preparing more materials in the Wantoat language for recording. In March of this year, Pastor Nickson went out to the Wantoat area again to record the last of the materials they had translated. He sent us a very encouraging report, saying that the Wantoat church leaders were well prepared and enthusiastic to help finish the recordings. Pastor Nickson is now working on editing the recordings and duplicating them on cassette tapes for distribution.
